The 1st Amendment to the U.S. Constitution says:

The 2nd Amendment to the U.S. Constitution says:

A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

As has been said many times, I may not agree with what you say, but I will defend to the death your right to say it.

Borderline is a book that supports women and girls understanding that they have the right, and also the responsibility, to defend themselves against sexual assault and rape by any means necessary.
